In partnership with the American Academy of Pediatrics-Maryland Chapter, Pathfinders conducted

9 developmental screening trainings

for 203 medical professionals on the use of standardized screening tools at regular intervals to detect developmental delays, including autism. Through a very generous grant from the WBAL Kids Campaign, Pathfinders offered FREE recreational opportunities, such as swimming lessons, music therapy, therapeutic riding, and gymnastics for 84 individuals with autism.
